- 1. God's economy works differently than ours. The more we give to God, the more we receive. (Matthew 16:25²; Luke 6:38³)
- 2. The Creator of the universe has taken time to notice us and our stewardship. When we return the tithe to God first, He has promised to bless us beyond our ability to receive. (Psalm 8:3, 4; Malachi 3:10⁶; 2 Chronicles 16:9a; Proverbs 3:9, 10⁵)
- 3. God actually challenges us to scientifically test Him by returning the tithe, or the first tenth of our increase. He is eager to show us and those around us, what He can do with those who are faithful. (Malachi 3:10¹⁴; Proverbs 3:9, 10⁵)
- 4. Returning tithe is a trust relationship with God. Until we venture something in experiential faith it is just a theory. But when we do, we will see God's faithfulness to His promises, and our faith will grow. (Malachi 3:10-12⁶; Hebrews 11:1, 6, 7-8; James 2:20-26)
- 5. Tithe is God's appointed means of supporting those who minister in our behalf and is best managed when brought to the storehouse or His church. (1 Corinthians 9:14⁹; Matthew 10:10; Malachi 3:10¹⁴)
- 6. Tithe is merely the minimum. God also observes our free will giving or our offerings as a gauge of our love and faithfulness to Him. After all, He doesn't need our money–He wants our hearts. (Malachi 3:8; Proverbs 23:26)
- 7. When we seek God first, every other aspect in our life falls into place, including our finances. This is the only way we can be faithful stewards of what He has entrusted to us. (Matthew $6:33^{15}$)

Choices: I choose to return to God a faithful tithe and offering, to show I have faith in Him and to allow Him to prove to the world around me that there is indeed a faithful, promise keeping God. (Hebrews 10:23)
