1. Of the major world religions, Judaism, Islam, Buddhism and Christianity, only in Christianity do we find that the founder, though He died, was resurrected. (Matthew 28:1-8; Mark 16:1-9; Luke 24:1-12; John 19:33-35¹; 20:1-8, 9², 10-20)
2. The resurrection of Christ is THE foundation upon which Christianity rests. On this point there is no middle ground. Either He died and rose from the dead or there is no rational foundation for the Christian faith! (1 Corinthians 15:14¹⁶; Romans 1:4¹³)
3. The compelling story of Christ's, death and resurrection, are further amplified and solidly confirmed when compared with prophecy. (Psalm 34:20 & John 19:33-35¹; Psalm 16:10⁷; 49:15⁸ & Matthew 28:2-6)
4. The disciples were too afraid to be associated with Him during the awful trial leading to His death. The fact that they walked and talked with Him after His resurrection turned them from cowards to bold witnesses of His life, death, and resurrection until they died. (Matthew 26:31; Mark 14:50, 68-71; Acts 14:3; 3:15)
5. The resurrection of Christ from the dead is personally compelling for yet another reason. If God can take a dead man and give him life, then God can also take our lifeless hearts, lost in trespasses and sin, and recreate them, just as He prophesied and promised. (1 Corinthians 15:20-22¹⁰; Romans 1:4¹³; Ezekiel 36:26; Ephesians 2:1; Jude 1:24)
6. All since Adam have sinned and have inherited death. Christ, through His death and resurrection, has given all access to eternal life. (1 Corinthians 15:20-22¹⁰; 1 John 1:2; 5:11; Romans 6:23)
7. Death is an enemy to God who created people to live forever. In the end, death will be no more! (John 3:16; 1 Corinthians 15:26; Revelation 21:4)

TESTIMONY OF THE TOMB

Comparison of the Gospels:

Jesus was taken to Pilate (Matthew 27:1-2; Luke 23:1-5; John 18:28; Mark 15:1-5). Pilate offered Barabbas in place of Jesus, but the people cried against Jesus, "CRUCIFY HIM!" (Matthew 27:15-26; Mark 15: 6-15; Luke 23:13-25; John 18:39-40; 19:1-16) He was taken out and crucified on a hill (Matthew 27:32-37; Mark 15:21-32; Luke 23:26-38; John 19:17-24) Just before He died He called out, "It is finished." (Matthew 27:45-51; Mark 15:33-41; Luke 23:44-49; John 19:28-30). Jesus rose from the grave three days later (Matthew 28:1-8; Mark 16:1-8; Luke 24:1-12; John 20:1-10).

1. **John 19:33-35** But when they came to Jesus, and saw that he was dead already, they brake not his legs: But one of the soldiers with a spear _____ his side, and forthwith came there out blood and water. And he that saw it bare record, and his record is true: and he knoweth that he saith true, that ye might believe.
2. **John 20:9** For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the _____.
